How to... use Adobe presenter to record a video

When and why would you want to do this?

Supporting the teaching approach of the flipped classroom, providing the lecture material before the lecture may create an improved learning experience for students. Recording your PowerPoint presentation with voice and or annotations allows students to review the material before class and allows the opportunity for active learning in class - to apply and further analyze the course material during the discussion.

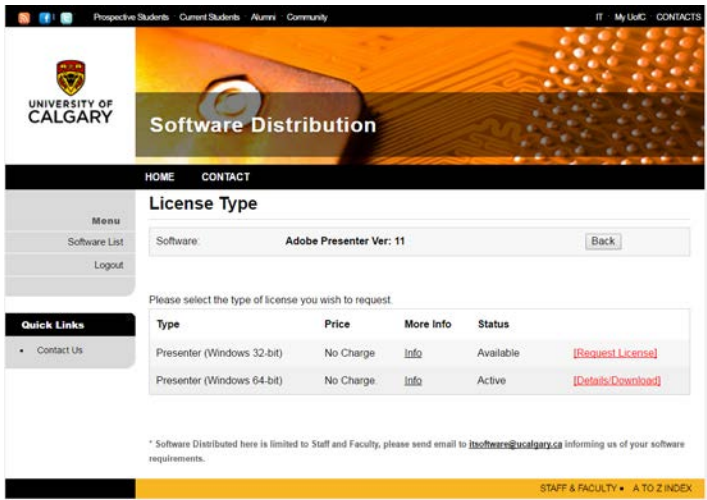

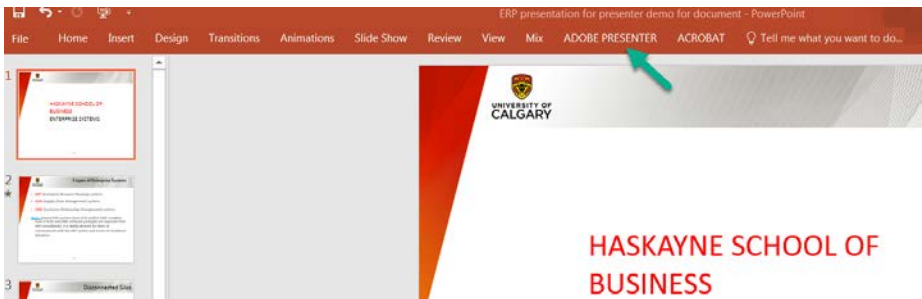
Adobe Presenter

Highlights: Using Adobe Presenter Video Express, use web cam to record yourself speaking as you navigate through your presentation. Adobe Presenter is accessible from PowerPoint and creates a video file of the presentation. Less intuitive than office mix, especially when using two monitors.

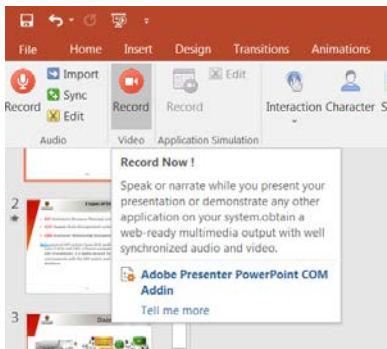
1. Adobe Presenter is available from Software Services. Follow the installation instructions.



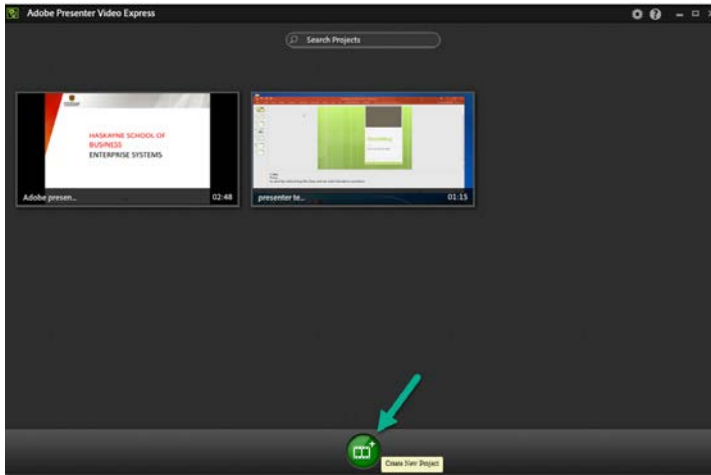
2. Open your slide deck in PowerPoint, select ADOBE PRESENTER from the menu bar



3. Select Record



4. Select Create new project



Select Record

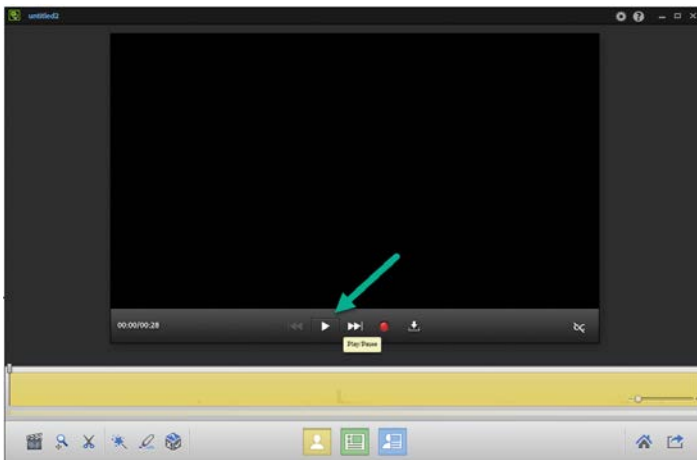


A timer will appear and begin a countdown.

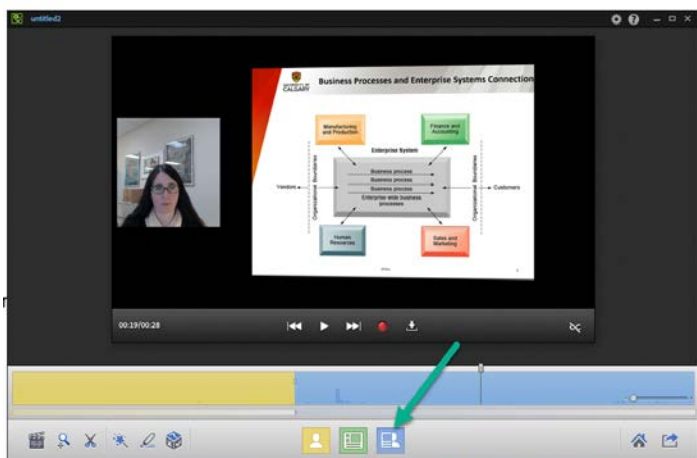


5. Use your keyboard arrows to move through your slide deck as you narrate. As shown above: To END RECORDING: Select Shift + end, To PAUSE: Ctrl + Alt +P

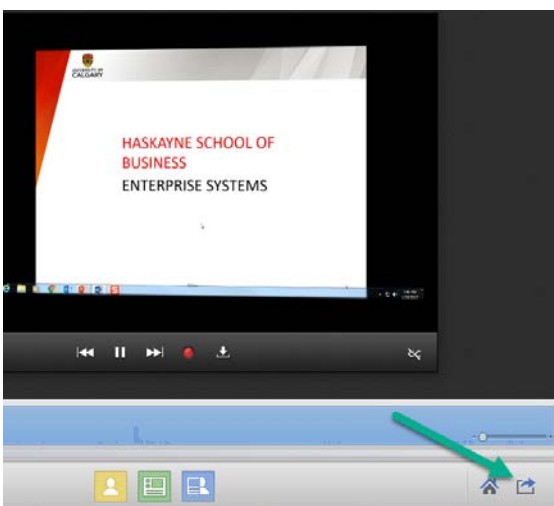
6. When you have completed the slide deck select play to review.



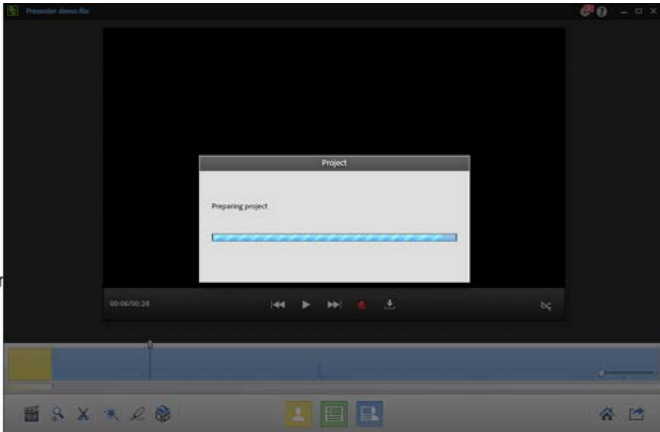
7. To view the presentation and presenter side by side select the blue icon.



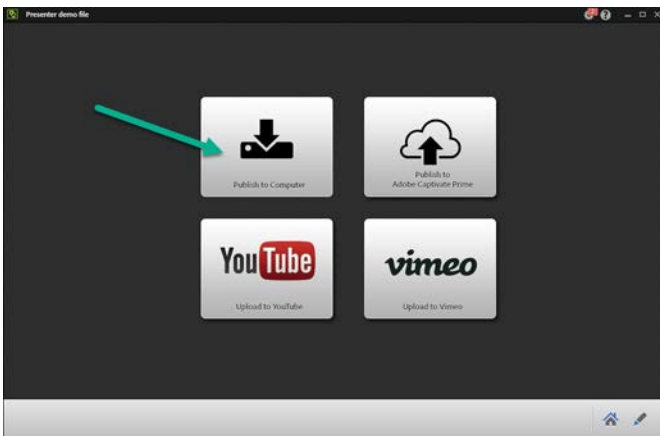
8. Select the publish icon to create the video file.



9. Name the file and presenter will prepare the video file.



10. Select publish to computer. Saving a local file and then uploading to YouTube or another location is recommended.



11. The video will save in MP4 format.
